RESOLUTION 2007/034

A RESOLUTION BY THE MONROE CITY COUNCIL TO AMEND RESOLUTION 2007/029, ESTABLISH FEES, FINES, PENALTIES, INTEREST AND CHARGES FOR 2008

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Monroe has determined that it is in the best interests of the City of Monroe to provide a single, efficient, and convenient listing of all fees, fines, penalties, interest, and charges for permits, licenses, services, applications and filing fees; and

WHEREAS, such a listing will better facilitate the updating and uniform review of all such fees, fines, penalties, interest and charges on a periodic basis;

WHEREAS, the City Council has adopted a park mitigation fee ordinance;

WHEREAS, effective September 1, 2007, as per current Garbage Collection contract, between the City of Monroe and Waste Management, the rates and charges are to be adjusted by 70% of the 3.89% increase in the Consumer Price Index. This increase is only to be adjusted on the "Service Fee Component" only.

WHEREAS, on July 24, 2007, Resolution No. 2007/020 was adopted including amendments to engineering fees, said amendments should have included current fees that were omitted, those fees were adopted by Resolution 2006/021 on December 19, 2006.

WHEREAS, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) reduced processing fees for fingerprint based background checks for both State and Federal , effective October 1, 2007;

WHEREAS, School Mitigation Fees were adopted in September according to Ordinance No. 019/2007

WHEREAS, previous Resolutions provide for fees that require review from time to time, are hereafter amended;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROE, WASHINGTON, THAT THE FOLLOWING FEES, FINES, PENALTIES, INTEREST, AND CHARGES BE ESTABLISHED:

Permits Not Required:

One-story detached accessory buildings, within residential zones, not exceeding 200 square feet and meets zoning and building code setback requirements. Accessory buildings are classified as tool sheds, woodsheds, storage areas, patio covers, playhouses, gazebos, hot tub enclosures, and similar uses. Accessory buildings must be considered to be portable and may not be constructed on permanent foundations such as poured in place concrete footings or poured in place concrete poles or posts.

Re-roofing of single-family residences -Only for the removal/replacement of a single layer with the same weight materials, and not including replacement of framing members and roof sheathing, accessory buildings, garages.

Re-roofing of commercial-Only minor repairs less than 2 squares.

Patio slabs, pavers, private walkways and patio covers not exceeding 200 square feet, provided light, ventilation and emergency egress comply with applicable code.

Building fees are calculated per the Building Valuation Data Table. Staff shall apply changes to the Building Valuation Data Table as published.

Tire-rebuilding Plants	Operation and maintenance of a tire-rebuilding plant
Waste Handling	Operation of wrecking yards, junk yards and waste material-handling facilities
Wood products	Storing chips, hogged material, lumber or plywood in excess of 200 cubic feet (6 m3)
